



Review any LUX-Dx[™] ICM Patient on LATITUDE Clarity[™]

See how LUX-Dx helps streamline your workflow

The new LATITUDE Clarity Temporary Healthcare Provider Access allows healthcare providers who are not part of the patient's primary following clinic to obtain read-only observer access.

With this addition, the LUX-Dx ICM System provides convenient and efficient tools to enable patient data review for a variety of care settings.

- Two workflow needs primary/following and acute care/observing – in one single LATITUDE Clarity login
- No more waiting for a following device clinic to send over the data or a Boston Scientific rep to come on-site



What you need to get started with observer access

- Any smart device (smartphone, tablet, laptop, or desktop) to visit the LATITUDE Clarity website (https://www.latitude.bostonscientific.com)
- Access to secure Wi-Fi or cellular connection
- LATITUDE Clarity login and password
- LUX-Dx Clinic Assistant with magnet or myLUX Patient App with magnet
- Patient's ICM model number, serial number and date of birth (find them on myLUX, Clinic Assistant or patient's medical ID card)



1. Device interrogration

Clinicians can either use the LUX-Dx Clinic Assistant and magnet to interrogate the ICM device, or have the patient do a manual transmission on the myLUX™ Patient App. This step is recommended to get the latest transmission data.



2. Data access

To view the data transmission, log in to the Clarity website. Select "Manage Patient" > "View Another Clinic's Patient" and input the patient's ICM model number, serial number, and date of birth to find the patient.



3. Review information

The patient data is now ready for the read-only review. This includes latest transmission, event history, trends and counters.

4. End access

The temporary observer data access to this patient will automatically expire after 24 hours; observing clinicians will no longer see this patient shown on their patient list.



LATITUDE Clarity™ provides device checks and remote patient management for any LUX-Dx™ patient in the following settings:

- Following clinics
- Non-following care settings:
 - Critical care
 - Inpatient
 - Cath lab
 - Surgery centre
 - Patient clinic
 - Emergency room/emergency department
 - Timely patient data access for any patient right at the point of care
 - Patient data remains centralised and consistent on LATITUDE Clarity for following and observing clinicians

The Temporary Healthcare Provider Access is for clinicians with a LATITUDE Clarity account set at the right access levels (Limited or Complete). To interrogate the patient, LUX-Dx Clinic Assistant and magnet are required.
