

Erectile dysfunction can limit intimacy, affect self-esteem and impact relationships. But there's good news – there are available options to treat ED.

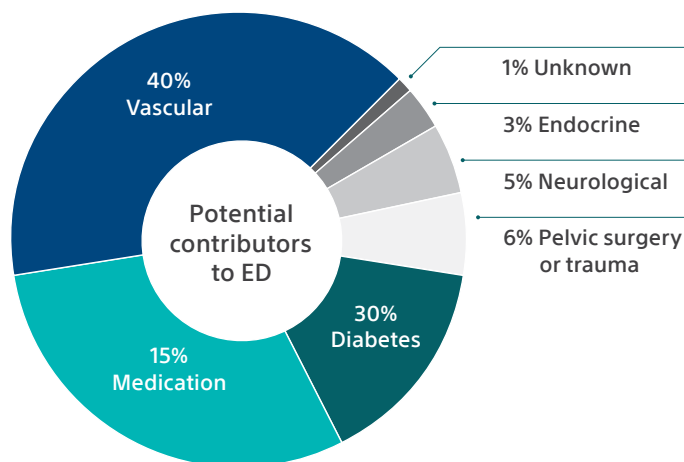
What is erectile dysfunction?

Erectile dysfunction (ED) is defined as the inability to achieve or maintain a penile erection sufficient for sexual intercourse. It is a common problem, and it's important to know you're not alone.

ED is not just a medical issue;
it can also deeply affect relationships.¹

What causes ED?

ED happens when blood flow to the penis is limited or nerves are damaged. The cause can be physical, psychological, or a combination of both. Psychological causes include stress, anxiety, guilt, and depression. Physical causes include diabetes, vascular disease, side effects of medications, and prostate cancer treatment.

The Tactra Malleable Penile Prosthesis is intended for use in the treatment of erectile dysfunction (impotence) in adult males. Implanting a penile prosthesis will damage or destroy any remaining natural ability to have a spontaneous erection, as well as make other treatment options impossible.

Men with diabetes, spinal cord injuries, or skin infections may have an increased risk of infection. Implantation may result in penile shortening, curvature or scarring. Additional information is provided in Patient Literature, available through your doctor.

What are available treatment options?

Whatever the cause of ED, there are treatment options available.

Treatments include medications, vacuum erection devices, injections, and intraurethral suppositories. A penile implant is a long-term treatment option for men with ED, providing the ability to have an erection whenever and wherever desired.



Tactra™ Malleable Penile Implant

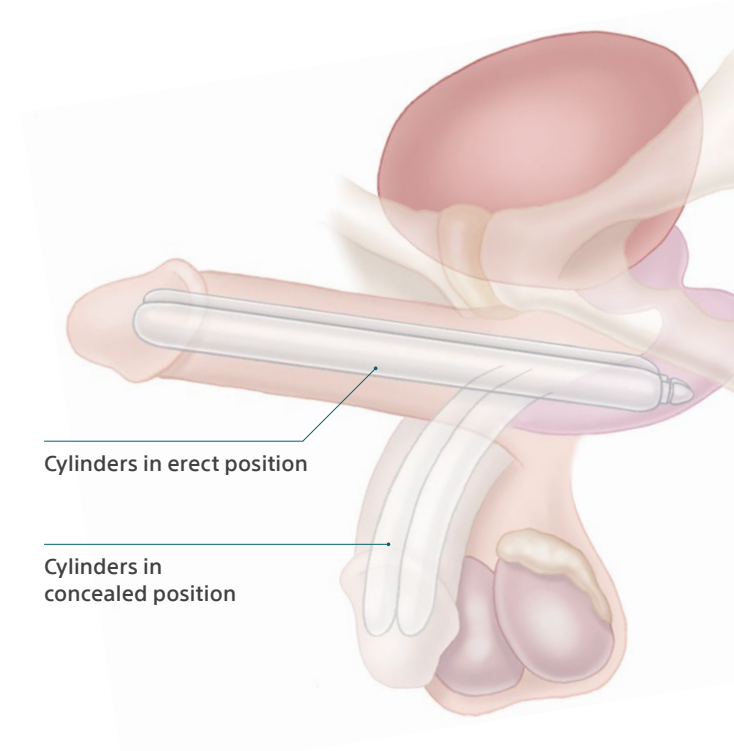
Concealed inside the body, the Tactra Malleable Penile Implant is simple to operate. The device can be positioned with minimal effort, enabling the penis to remain erect for as long as desired.

How it works

The Tactra Penile Implant is designed with simplified sizing to address a wide spectrum of patient anatomy. This device is made of a thick, dual layer of silicone over a Nitinol (nickel titanium) core designed for a natural feel, optimal rigidity, and durability. When not in use for sex, the implant can be manually pushed down for concealment, for a discreet, natural appearance. The Tactra Penile implant is designed to feel natural during intercourse.

Could a Tactra penile implant be right for you?

- Designed to be a long-term treatment option for ED
- Spontaneous — you can have sex when the mood strikes
- Concealability — can be manually pushed down for concealment when not in use for sex
- Once positioned, the implant enables the penis to remain erect for as long as desired
- Designed to feel natural during intercourse
- Designed to be appropriate for daily activities without interference



Potential risks associated with a Tactra penile implant:

- Organic erections will no longer be possible
- Infection, in which case the implant may have to be removed. Certain conditions, such as diabetes, spinal cord injuries, or skin infections, may increase infection risk.
- Pain, which is typically associated with the healing process
- Erosion, which may require additional surgery to treat
- Device replacement, lifetime of implant is 10 years
